



Ian Moore - nominated by the Canadian Geotechnical Society for the Stirling Medal

Dr. Ian Moore, one of the world's foremost researchers in the field of buried infrastructure, is recognized for his extraordinary leadership and contributions to service, at the national and local levels, and to the CGS. On behalf of the CGS, as a joint Editor of the Fourth edition of the Canadian Foundation Engineering Manual (2006), Ian led a CGS team who updated a Manual that is extensively used by geotechnical professionals across Canada and internationally.

As founding chair of the Kingston Section of the CGS between 2006 and 2010, Ian led development of a vibrant new chapter of the national society, engaging local experts from industry, academia, and government, and building strong links between the substantial graduate student community at Queen's and RMC and the learned society. In addition, as the founding Executive Director of the GeoEngineering Centre at Queen's-RMC, Ian has led the development of one of North America's largest and internationally respected teams of GeoEngineering scholars.
