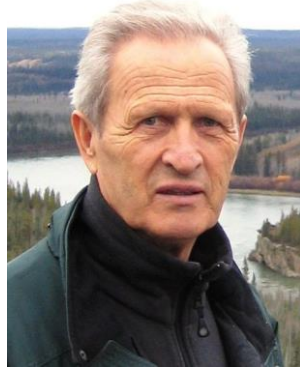

Boro Lukajic

Mr. Boro Lukajic has continuously distinguished himself in engineering and geotechnical professions for several decades. He has an impressive record in designing, constructing and managing engineering projects in the areas of hydroelectric power, transportation and nuclear power. Mr. Lukajic has participated in numerous projects in Canada, U.S.A., Central and South America.

Boro's early engineering experience dates back to 1968 with Acres International in Niagara Falls, Ontario. With Acres he travelled world-wide in pursuit of his engineering experience. As an employee of Ontario Hydro between 1977 and 1993, he spearheaded engineering programs related to hydro dams, tunnelling for nuclear generation projects and nuclear waste management programs. He is one of the participants in the establishment of the Ontario Hydro Dam Safety program. He was a group leader in the design and rehabilitation of numerous hydraulic dams.

Mr. Lukajic served as President of the Tunnelling Association of Canada between 1994 and 1998. He is well known for his many contributions to the international tunnelling community. He represented Canada on international forums and played a pivotal role in organizing the International Tunnelling Congress held in Toronto in 1989. He has authored over 30 technical papers and holds awards from the Tunnelling Association of Canada and CGS.
